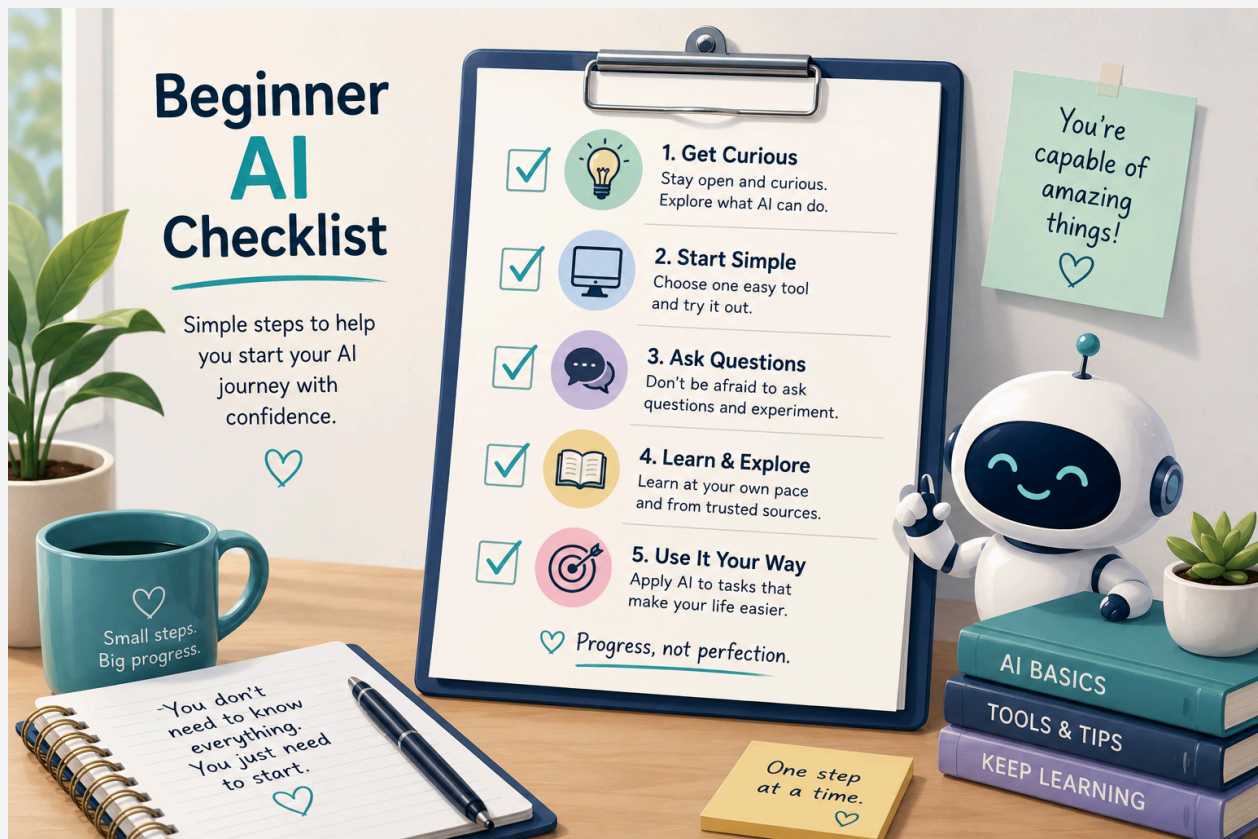


Beginner AI Checklist

Exploring AI with More Clarity

Artificial intelligence can feel exciting, confusing, overwhelming, or even intimidating depending on where you begin.

CHECKLIST SECTION 1



Understanding The Basics

- Learn what AI actually is
- Understand the difference between AI tools and search engines
- Learn what prompts are
- Explore how AI generates responses
- Understand that AI can make mistakes
- Learn basic AI vocabulary and concepts

CHECKLIST SECTION 2



Exploring AI Tools

- Try a conversational AI tool like ChatGPT or Gemini
- Ask AI to explain something unfamiliar
- Experiment with simple prompts
- Compare responses between different AI tools
- Practice asking follow-up questions
- Explore AI for one practical everyday task

Examples:

- writing emails
- brainstorming ideas
- organizing schedules
- summarizing information
- planning projects

CHECKLIST SECTION 3



Building Confidence

- Focus on learning one tool at a time
- Avoid comparing yourself to AI experts online
- Practice refining prompts gradually
- Save prompts and responses you find useful
- Learn through curiosity instead of pressure
- Allow yourself to experiment without needing perfect results

You do not need technical expertise to begin using AI thoughtfully.

CHECKLIST SECTION 4



Understanding What Matters

- Learn where AI is genuinely useful
- Learn where AI still struggles
- Verify important information independently
- Understand that hype and reality are often different
- Explore how AI may affect your own work or interests
- Stay thoughtful instead of fearful or blindly optimistic

CHECKLIST SECTION 5



Healthy AI Habits

- Take breaks from constant AI news and hype
- Use AI as a tool, not a replacement for judgment
- Protect personal and sensitive information
- Stay curious without feeling pressured to keep up constantly
- Focus on practical understanding over trends

Learning AI does not need to feel rushed, intimidating, or overwhelming.

Most people are still figuring out:

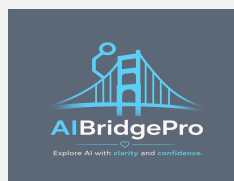
- where these tools fit
